



## **Suggested Prayers - Sunday – 21<sup>st</sup> of June 2020**

### **1. A prayer of praise (based on Psalm 103)**

Help Lucy and Miriam adjust to life in Australia and operating in English rather than Spanish as their primary language day to day. Please comfort them in their grief of leaving Monterrey.

We thank you for the partnership in the gospel we've had with the Sholl family and pray they continue to serve you faithfully and that you will continue to grow the work of MOCLAM as it transitions to the next phase. Amen.
